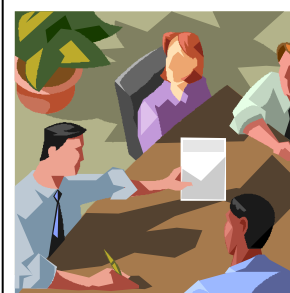

Finally -- A minister was a was asked to dinner by a church member he knew to be a very poor housekeeper.

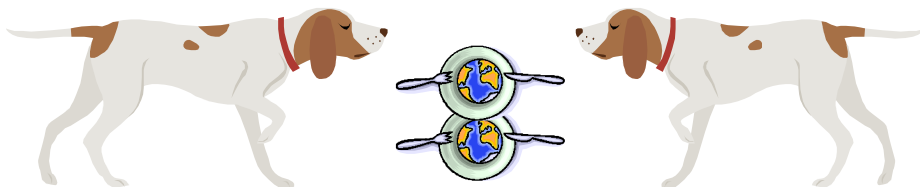
When he sat down at the table, he noticed that the dishes were filthier than any that he had ever seen in his life.
